

Puppy Pre-School General Syllabus

Orientation: Moms, Dads and other family members are welcome. Please do not bring puppy this day.

Week 1 is puppy's introduction to the class setting. We'll start with brief controlled puppy play time then begin work on bit inhibition, preventing resource guarding and new commands; leave it, drop it, take it, sit. Puppy will also be introduced to "Wheels & Sounds".

Week 2 begins with puppy play time then a review the previous week. New commands will be introduced such as on/off, in/out, wait, down and stand. Puppy will experience "Obstacles" this week.

Week 3 begins with puppy play time then a review the previous week. We'll begin work on destructive behaviors, Scary Monsters and "Gotcha". Puppy will learn or improve on recalls and new games will be introduced. Puppies will experience "Costumes" this week.

Week 4 begins with puppy play time. We'll review then work on loose leash walking, "alone" training, restraint, touching/handling and daily walks. Puppies will experience "Health & Handling" this week.

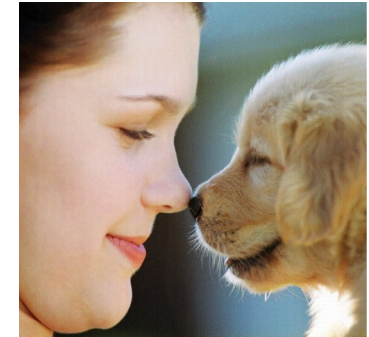

The Importance of Socialization

Socialization is the process of developing relationships with other living beings, people, and animals.

•Socialization Period

-typically 3 to 14 weeks of age.

•Fear Period

-typically 8 to 12 weeks of age.

Puppy Pre-School provides controlled exposure to many new experiences in a positive manner to ensure the best outcome. Puppies that have been affected by *adverse* experiences during the fear period often cannot be rehabilitated.

Your puppy is in a critical time of his development and we will never be able to shape his personality as much as we can right now.

All of our instructors advocate positive reinforcement and will teach you how to use this powerful tool effectively.

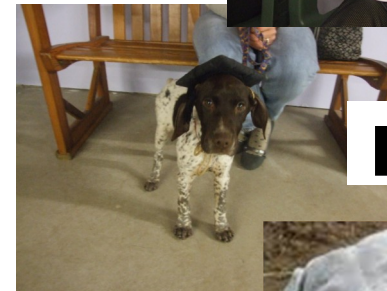
